Activities & Tasks

Data Collection & Management

Intern may be responsible for the intake of significant data, including collecting survey responses, environmental observations, focus group notes, researching existing sources, etc. Intern may also enter data, identify new data sources, and track data collection.

Data Analysis & Dissemination

Intern may assist in data analysis as needed, including identifying and communicating key findings. Working collaboratively with program staff such as the Epidemiology Unit, the intern may draft reports, develop written or visual presentations, and assist in the dissemination of results to stakeholders, decision-makers, and the general community.

Ideal Candidate:

- Experience working or volunteering in a field related to health, community outreach, communications, or another related area.
- Experience leading/working on a team to complete group projects or host events.
- Comfortable talking with people in a public setting.
- Great attitude and willingness to try new things.
- Self-starter who is comfortable figuring out the best ways to complete tasks.

Design Materials, Messaging, & Social Media

Intern may create written, graphic, or audio materials to convey important messages to specific audiences. These materials may include social media posts, flyers, recruitment materials, print advertisements, infographics, podcasts, short videos, fact sheets, white pages, data visualizations, etc. Intern will work with program staff to ensure that messages employ best practices in health communications, and that they are approved before being published or disseminated.

Outreach & Coalition Building

Intern may participate in a variety of invited community events and local health-focused coalitions. Events and coalition meetings may involve interacting with and/or providing education to the general public, youth, and/or professional partners from local agencies. Interns will represent the Public Health Department with professionalism at all times, and will share any important information or feedback from these events with program staff.

Other Duties

Other duties may be assigned within the realm of entry-level office tasks, including but not limited to filing, archiving, and/or other clerical work.



SUMMARY

The intern(s) will work primarily under the direction of the Program Supervisor, with regular input and task management from other program staff. Interns will work a total of 8-16 hours per week during their

internship period, in person at the TCPH office, and may be assigned to a variety of different programs. Regular activities and tasks will vary, but will include a combination of the duties above in order to give the intern an overview of work throughout the Public Health Department.
