

Student records: Ed Code 49061 states that parents of community college students do not have a right to access their children's student records, regardless of whether or not the student is under the age of 18. As such, student records will not be released to parents without written consent of the student. The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) Authorization for Release of Information can be obtained at the Admissions & Records office.
