## Get Enough Sleep! May is National Better Sleep Month!

Consider this: The Exxon Valdez oil spill and the nuclear incidents at Chernobyl and Three Mile Island all happened between midnight and 4:00 AM local time. All three events were linked to human error with sleepiness as a contributing cause.

Also, sleepy drivers cause 100,000 car crashes and more than 1500 deaths each year, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

And locally, within the last several months the community experienced the tragic loss of two youth and an elderly woman in a car accident where lack of sleep seems to be the likely cause.

Humans can survive longer without food than without sleep.

WHAT IS SLEEP?

WHILE IT IS STILL A BIT OF A MYSTERY, SLEEP IS AN ACTIVITY THE BODY NEEDS. THERE IS A LOT GOING ON IN OUR BODIES AND MINDS DURING SLEEP.
SLEEP IS CONTROLLED BY HORMONES AND OUTSIDE CUES, LIKE SUNRISE AND MEAL TIMES, AND OCCURS IN A CYCLE OF ROUGHLY 24 HOURS. A CHANGE IN SCHEDULE OR LOSS OF SLEEP DISRUPTS A NATURAL CYCLE AND PUTS US "OUT OF SYNC."

What happens When You Don't Get Enough Sleep?

- increased-irritability
- decreased motivation, memory and concentration
- decreased creativity and spontaneity
- increased proneness to injury
- greater likelihood of problems such as stomach upset and headaches
- accumulation of "sleep debt." Eventually this debt must be paid, even if it means falling asleep at a bad time.

#### WHAT TO DO:

FIND TIMES TO NAP: If you can't get enough sleep at night, find times to nap. Naps help pay off sleep debt. If you anticipate a night with too little sleep, a nap beforehand seems to work best to reduce sleep loss problems. If you suffer from insomnia, napping is not as good a thing. For insomnia, relaxation practices like yoga or Tai Chi are better than naps.

REDUCE STRESS: Stress can lead to sleep loss (surprise, surprise....). Exercising regularly helps this, though not within 2 hours of going to bed. If you lie awake worrying try this: keep a worry journal beside your bed and make a list of the days worries in the book and then close it. Also, concentrate on outside sounds like the crickets outside or your own breathing instead of the thoughts in your head.

KEEP YOUR SLEEP-WAKE CLOCK AND EXTERNAL CUES IN SYNC: As much as possible, keep to a regular schedule for meals, bedtime and rising. Sleep in a darkened room. A quiet room or "white noise" such as a fan may help.

AVOID: Caffeine, alcohol, nicotine, diet pills
