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If your spouse or parent was a law enforcement or fire fighter who was killed on duty, you may be eligible for a Board of Governors' (BOG) Fee Waiver.

The deceased person must have been:

- A resident of California,
- Employed by a public agency,
- Principally employed in active law enforcement or active fire suppression and prevention, and
- Killed in the performance of active law enforcement or active fire suppression or prevention duties

*If these circumstances apply to you, contact the human resources department of the public agency that employed your spouse or parent to obtain documentation that you are eligible for this fee waiver. Return this documentation to the Financial Aid office for processing.*
