End-of Term Meeting

In this meeting, you will: 1) evaluate the EOPS services, 2) plan your Summer/Fall course schedule, 3) reflect upon your successes and challenges this semester, and 4) receive an update on your EOPS status.

Summer Services

EOPS is able to help with book and transportation assistance for the Summer Term. To receive services: 1) you must be a continuing EOPS student who is eligible for Fall EOPS services; 2) you must have completed your third required contact in spring; 3) you must have registered for a Summer class that begins **before July 1**st. In addition to a book voucher, you will also be eligible for a parking permit or bus passes for the summer.
