Columbia College Campus Veteran Benefits & Support

- 1. Veterans with a minimum of one year of satisfactory service may receive a waiver of the general education Area E requirement. They may also receive two semester units of elective credit and waive institutional physical activity requirements for graduation. Please submit your DD214 to Admissions and Records.
- 2. The Veteran's Resource Center is located in the Toyon building. Veterans can utilize this quiet area to study, access the internet, print for free, enjoy a snack, and meet with other veterans. You can also meet with our veteran counselor, Brian Jensen, when he has drop-in hours at that location.
- 3. Columbia College has a full-time mental health counselor, Tamara Oxford, who is located in the Pinyon building. You can make an appointment by calling 209-588-5346.
- 4. Admissions and Records offers book vouchers up to \$250.00 per semester on a first-come, first-served basis to help those veterans who may not have any other way to pay for books. The vouchers may only be used in our Columbia College online bookstore. Chapter 35 DEA students are not eligible for the book voucher.
- 5. We are also offering limited parking permit vouchers on a first-come, first-served basis for those veterans who need help paying for a semester parking pass. Check in with Admissions and Records for additional information.
